Speakers

Greg Brann, a multi-generational farmer, owns and operates Big Spring Farm. His operation consists of 675 acres in Allen County, KY where he focuses on improving soils through diversity in plant and animal species as well as management techniques. His cattle, sheep, and hogs are direct marketed in the Nashville/Bowling Green area. He currently raises 400 sheep, 100 cattle, and 34 hogs. Greg's private consulting practice, Synergistic Grazing Management, provides land management planning to farmers, ranchers, land preservation organizations, and public land managers. Greg has served as the Technical Advisor to BEHAVE, Tennessee Forage and Grassland Council, and the American Sheep Industry. He has developed land management plans as varied as the 100,000 acres at Fort Campbell Military Base to diversified farms of only 25 acres. Looking past symptoms to discover and resolve root issues, his plans provide practical ideas to help in reaching aspired goals.

Beau Ramsburg is the owner and operator of Rettland Farm in Gettysburg, PA, a pasture-based livestock farm and USDA meat processing plant. The farm produces pastured broilers, ducks, and turkeys, as well as pastured pigs and lamb. The farm processes its own animals under USDA inspection for direct sale to retail and wholesale accounts throughout central PA and the Mid-Atlantic region. The farm also offers customized, small scale meat processing services for other farms in the region, helping them to add value to their livestock as well.
